

## INTRO REMARKS:

Thomas Carlisle's poem "You, Jonah" (last two stanzas):

And Jonah stalked to his shaded seat and waited for God to come around to his way of thinking.

And God is still waiting for a host of Jonah's in their comfortable houses to come around to His way of loving.

## "DIVING INTO" OUR PASSAGE:

- 1. Jonah's objection: Reveals his rebellious heart (1-3).
- 2. God's object lesson (the plant) reveals Jonah's divided heart (4-9).
- 3. God's objective: forgiveness, a loving heart (10-11).

## MAIN TAKEAWAY:

When we lose God's love for others we will become consumed by our own desires and prejudices...self-centered.

## APPLYING TO LIFE:

Become God-centered instead of self-centered. Let God replace your prejudices, anger and frustration with his love for people.
